Technology Alliance announces Carol Rava as new CEO

SEATTLE, WA, January 13, 2016 – The Board of the Technology Alliance has selected Carol Rava as the new CEO of the organization, succeeding Susannah Malarkey, who has been the Executive Director of the Technology Alliance since its inception in 1996.

Rava brings a wealth of experience to her new assignment leading the Technology Alliance, a not-for-profit organization of technology leaders committed to a vibrant innovation economy that benefits all of Washington State's citizens. Previously Rava co-launched Get Schooled, a digital and game-based platform to motivate low-income teens to graduate from high school and go on to college. In prior roles, she served as Executive Director of Strategic Planning and Partnerships at Seattle Public Schools and Deputy Director of Education at the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

"Today Washington is known as a technology-friendly state - for companies and increasingly for students. This is in a large part due to the work of the Technology Alliance over the past 20 years," said Rava. "I am honored and humbled to take the helm of this organization and look forward to continuing to create an education, economic and research climate conducive to innovation and supportive of the technology sector at-large."

Cheryl Vedoe, Chair of the Technology Alliance and CEO of Apex Learning, commented that "The entire board is thrilled to have Carol Rava take over as the next leader of the Technology Alliance. We have accomplished a great deal during Susannah Malarkey's tenure and we know Carol will build on our past accomplishments as we face the challenges of growing and sustaining our success as a leading technology state."

Over the past 20 years, the Technology Alliance has brought together leaders from across the state's technology sector to create a shared vision of how Washington can support and embrace innovation – from research to company investment to the classroom.
